INTRODUCTION

These proposals follow initial preparatory work undertaken during 1999, initial committee briefing dated 10 May 1999, and comments received in writing and follow up committee discussion August 1999 and updated December 2007.

The 'Code' is divided into various parts reflecting the constituent elements of St Brigids GAC Belfast.

The document draws on various official documents including the official Code of Conduct for GAA club officials/officers, players and supporters.

In addition the document concentrates on the well-being of children in our care and draws heavily from 'Our Duty to Care' Principles of Good Practice for the protection of Children and Young People, published by Child Care (NI) and commissioned by the Northern Ireland Department of Health and Social Services Child Care Unit.
